

## **Sean Stidfole:**

A key piece of one of the Atlantic League's top bullpens the last two seasons, Sean Stidfole has performed in a variety of relief roles for the York Revolution helping the team win back-to-back league championships in 2010 and 2011.

In his first season with the team, Stidfole earned a career-best 11 saves and posted a stellar 1.90 ERA while appearing in a then-league record 68 games. His efforts earned him an Atlantic League Second Team All-Star selection, just the second pitcher and first reliever in Revs history to garner All-Star accolades.

The right-hander capped the championship season by earning the win in relief in the Revs' first title-clinching victory in Bridgeport. He also set club records with an 18.1-inning, 17-appearance scoreless streak during the first half of the 2010 season.

Stidfole followed that with a solid 2011 campaign, earning a club record-tying five relief wins while posting a 3.79 ERA in 60 appearances. He now stands as the Revs' all-time career record-holder in appearances with 128 in his two seasons in York.

A Perry County native, Stidfole pitched at nearby Susquenita High School and Penn State University before being selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 14th round of the 2005 draft. Prior to coming to York, he rolled out ERAs of 3.27 and 3.70 at the Triple-A level over the previous two years. He spent the first five seasons of his pro career in the Blue Jays organization before signing with the Revs.

At Penn State, Stidfole was a two-time All-Big Ten selection, and pitched in the same rotation as his twin brother Alan, also an all-conference performer.
